FLOSS moves into its second season, building on the success of our first time through in 2018.

- It's a week (or two, or more) of camp.
- It's helping out with the Day Camp program
- It's a stepping stone towards being a counselor, and a great skill development opportunity.

FLOSS is designed to be a hybrid experience... participants are a little bit Camper, a little bit Junior Counselor; future leaders finding their feet and stretching their wings.

Who is FLOSS intended for?

- 13-16 years old
- Loves camp, and Skyline
- Enjoys working with peers and with younger children
- Thinking about maybe being a camp counselor when you're old enough.

What will the week look like?

- Arrive Sunday 2pm, play, do campy things, get ready for week.
- Monday-Thursday, after breakfast, be part of the leadership of the Day Camp program, until 5pm.
- FLOSS free time 5-7pm, then some learning/training, then join with camp evening program, campfires, etc.
- Friday - work with Day Camp until lunch, then debrief, pack up and celebrate!

When is it?

FLOSS will be running for FIVE weeks:

June 16-21
June 23-28
July 7-12
July 14-19
July 21-26

Participants can apply to do any number of weeks, and we'll try to spread it evenly.

Who is my week with?

- Other FLOSSers
- You have a counselor working with you, like normal camp.
- You'll be with Day Campers and staff during the day, and with peers during the evening program.
- FLOSS's maximum number each week is six, but you'll be engaged with the full camp program almost every minute.



Will I be a Camper or a Staff Member?

You'll be a camper, and you'll be learning what it takes to be a staff member, but will not have anything close to that level of responsibility. We hope that you'll join our staff in summers of the future.

How is it different to the previous Day Camp Assistant program?

The DCA program was good insofar as it gave participants a chance to learn-while-doing. It wasn't good enough as a camp experience for participants, since they had to go home on the same schedule as the day campers.

This meant less chances for DCA's to have their own fun at camp, and less opportunity for deeper skill building. It also meant that only people who lived within commuting distance could realistically participate.

Those who were DCAs in the past few years proved to us that a program like this is possible, and we're excited to see it evolve and be better for the participants and for the Day Campers, too.



Can it count for Community Service hours?

Yes. Participants will be putting in about 40 hours of service during the week, and we'll be happy to sign any forms you need to verify that. We'll also provide a certificate, letter and will write a reference for you if desired.

How much does it cost?

Less than a traditional week of camp - because you're older, more mature, and will be contributing to leadership.
